ADDENDUM #2 April 1, 2019

REQUEST FOR PHASE II PROPOSALS FOR REGIONAL BIOSOLIDS FACILITY, WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITY AND SANITARY SEWER COLLECTION SYSTEM NAUGATUCK, CONNECTICUT

Response to Questions

- 1. Is the geotech available for the 2 acre parcel identified in the RFP Phase 2 for use in the biosolids facility proposal? The information is located in Addendum #3, Phase I RFP. Addendum #3 and the geotechnical information is in the Borough's website in bid documents under the Phase I zip file entitled Addendums and site map.
- Is it possible to utilize additional area north of the 2 acre parcel identified?
 If so, how much might be available and is geotech available? For Proposal purposes do not assume that additional area north of the 2 acre parcel is available.
- 3. The RFP notes that an Addendum 3 was made to the existing least agreement. "The calculation of Annual Distributable New Revenue Surplus is specified in Article XIII of the Lease Agreement and was modified in Amendment #3 to the agreement." However, we are unable to locate this Amendment on the Borough website. Would it be possible to receive the document? Amendment #3 is located with the bid documents in the zip file named "all Phase II Documents" within the incinerator and WWTP files.
- 4. We are seeking some appendices to the Kleinfelder Facilities Plan. Where can I find Appendices E through K of that plan? Please see Part 4 recently added to the documents and forms link for the WPCF where there were previously Parts 1,2 and 3.

5. In the RFP the Borough had mentioned they had discussions with DEEP on land application. In order to stay coordinated, is there someone in particular at DEEP that the Borough has talked with? Yes, Jim Binder, consultant to the Borough, has spoken to Lee Sawyer at DEEP. They are considering the matter in general for compost, digestate and other land application situations, but it will be some time before they make a decision. As noted in the RFP, to be on firm ground for pricing, Proposers should not count on that happening in the immediate future, if at all. As we understand, it is possible at this time to seek a Beneficial Use Determination (BUD) from DEEP regarding specific cases for land application.
